Thursdays Storytime




Bi- Weekly Storytime Scheduled Dates:

May 6 to June 3, 2024 <u>Featured Book</u> *The Women* by Kristin Hannah Book Discussion: June 3 at 6 pm

Summary:

<u>The Women</u>, is about a young woman coming of age during the turbulent 1960's in America. Twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath, raised in the idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her parents, has always prided herself on doing the right thing. So, when her older brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself and enlists in the Army Nurse Corps.

Frankie is overwhelmed by destruction with each day there is risk, death, hope and betrayal. But this was just the beginning, the real battle is coming home to a changed, divided, angry America.

The Women is the story of one woman going to war, but it shines a light on all women whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has often been forgotten. A novel about friendships and bold patriotism.

With multiple books over the years reaching bestseller acclaim on various lists and charts, Kristin Hannah is one of the greatest storytellers of our time.
